

Going for games record

A WALTHAMSTOW man will be among 300 or more gaming students taking part in a national world record attempt.

Train2Game has teamed up with Microsoft to set the world record for the largest game jam held in a single location.

Art and animation student Joao Soares, 30, originally from Portugal, will be among those taking part in the gameathon at the University of Bedfordshire tomorrow (Friday).

Joao will create video games for Windows 8 in only 48 hours. The world record will be set with a target of 301 or more participants.

New father, Joao, of Wingfield Road, has always enjoyed playing computer video games and decided to join the Train2Game course so he could make them instead of just playing them. He said: "I've always been interested in animation and computers. The course means I am able to carry on with my waiter career to earn money while studying."

A judging process will also take place with gaming industry representatives choosing a best game of the show and games deemed suitable that Joao makes could be set for release.
